

## Sample Problem Card 2

As your expedition explores this portion of the pyramid, you run into a common problem encountered by archeological teams. Tons of fallen sand has blocked your progress down this corridor. As experts investigate this large mound of fallen sand, it is observed that on the left side of this obstacle is approximately a 15 inch space between the wall and the sand. The team agrees that since this mound is made of loose sand, the expedition can squeeze through for a distance of 15 to 20 yards and into an open hallway.

If you answer the question correctly, the group successfully squeezes through this opening and progresses down the corridor. Take a **PASSAGE PROGRESS CARD**, move your marker the designated number of spaces, and collect the designated number of hieroglyphic cards. If you answer the question incorrectly, the expedition unfortunately discovers, as you squeeze your bodies through this space, that sharp glasslike rocks are tearing through your clothing and slicing your skin. The team does get to the other side of the sand mound but not without team members receiving serious cuts and lacerations. Medical attention must be given to the injured. Your team loses its next turn.
